



St Kilda Festival Saturday 14 and Sunday 15 February 2026

Parking access, conditions and road closures – **Areas A and D** (Sunday only)

St Kilda Festival 2026 will be held on Saturday 14 and Sunday 15 February.

Full and partial road closures in your area will apply **between the hours of 3 am Sunday 15 February and 1 am Monday 16 February**. The following information relates **only** to Festival Sunday.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused by these road closures and hope the information provided will help minimise any disruption to your household. Our highest priority is to ensure a safe festival precinct for all involved.

Please find enclosed an Areas A and D Vehicle Access Pass with a road closure map.

You must display your Areas A and D Vehicle Access Pass on your vehicle on Sunday 15 February 2026

to gain access. Residents can access Areas A and D via either access point – via Grey Street from Barkly Street, or Princes Street from Barkly Street. Please note there will be heavy traffic in this location and delays can be expected. If you require an additional vehicle pass please contact skfaccrc@portphilip.vic.gov.au at your earliest convenience.

Full road closures (no access to any traffic)

- Fitzroy Street, between Grey Street (including the Grey/Canterbury intersection) and The Esplanade (including the Acland Street intersection)
- The Esplanade, between Fitzroy and Carlisle streets
- Lower Esplanade
- Acland Street, between Carlisle and Belford streets
- Cavell Street
- Shakespeare Grove, between Acland and Chaucer streets
- Jacka Boulevard, between Acland and Cavell streets

Partial road closures

- Lakeside Drive
- Carlisle Street, between Barkly and Acland Streets
- Pollington Street from The Esplanade, access via Victoria Street
- Grey Street, between Fitzroy and Barkly streets and all side streets off Grey Street

- Acland Street, between Jackson and Carlisle streets and all side streets off Acland Street
- Fitzroy Street, between St Kilda Road and Grey Street
- Princes Street and all side streets off Princes Street
- Pier Road
- Alfred Square, access for residents only (Vehicle Access Passes required)
- Beaconsfield Parade, between Cowderoy and Acland streets
- Marine Parade, between Cavell and Blessington streets
- Wimmera Place will be zoned for two-way traffic for Festival Sunday
- Robe Street will be zoned a two-way street for Festival Sunday allowing access down to Acland Street and then out to all other residential streets in this area
- Blessington Street, between Chaucer and Spenser streets (carpark) will be closed to traffic and general public
- Beach Road will be accessible via side streets for local traffic access only, between Kerferd Road and St Kilda Street without an access pass, with consideration of the above full and partial road closures

Other information

- Lower Esplanade will be closed on Saturday and Sunday.
- Jackson Street will be zoned a two-way street for Festival Sunday
- Acland Street will be zoned a two-way street, for the one-way section between Eildon Street and St Leonards Avenue for Festival Sunday

- The St Kilda Festival precinct is a tow-away zone from 3 am Sunday 15 February 2026 to 1 am Monday 16 February 2026. Vehicles within the precinct will be relocated to the Marine Parade carpark – call **03 9209 6306** for information on towed vehicles.

Taxis and rideshare vehicles

- Taxis and rideshare vehicles such as Uber and DiDi, will **not** be allowed in the road closure areas on Festival Sunday
- All rideshare phone apps will geo-block riders selecting any area within the road closure to limit traffic (including your address)
- Temporary taxi rank and rideshare locations:
 - Beaconsfield Parade at Catani Gardens
 - Fitzroy Street, north of Lakeside Drive
 - Marine Parade, south of Shakespeare Grove
 - The taxi rank located at the corner of Fitzroy and Acland streets will be closed on Sunday 15 February 2026

Flexi-car rental services

- There will be changes to the availability of carshare rental services on Festival weekend, please check directly with your provider for further details

Food delivery

- Food delivery services will not be allowed in the full road closure areas on Festival Sunday
- Food delivery services will be allowed into local access areas by scooter and bicycle only

eBikes and eScooters

- eBikes and eScooters will be geo-locked to run at reduced speed near the Festival area and will be completely unpowered within the Festival precinct
- This includes Lime Bikes, Lime Scooters and Neuron Scooters
- Personal eBikes and eScooters will need to dismount within pedestrianised areas in the Festival precinct
- There are designated Parking Stations at the following:
 - Corner of Lakeside Drive and Fitzroy Street
 - Catani Gardens near Beaconsfield Parade
 - Corner of Shakespeare Grove and Marine Parade


St Kilda Festival – Sunday 15 February 2026
